


THE CHEF'S RING









L 5th FLOOR BEDROOM SCENE R 5th FLOOR OPEN PLAN KITCHEN AND LOUNGE





The project involved creating an interior décor proposal for two luxury villas - Villa Étoile and Villa Soleil - within the C'est si Bon development in Clifton. The focus was on developing the "Barefoot Luxury" concept further through soft furnishings, décor, and window treatments, with an emphasis on clever spatial planning. The design direction was guided by a relaxed, coastal aesthetic using natural materials such as stone, plaster, and wood, and a light, textured fabric palette to evoke sophistication, serenity, and connection to the seaside setting


